From the Pastor's Desk ~

"I hereby command you: Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go." (Joshua 1:9 NRSVUE)

These words were spoken to Joshua shortly after Moses died. God was reminding him to not be afraid about the shift that was happening in his life and the life of the people of Israel. I'm sharing the above because I want to relieve any uncertainty that may be floating about. There is no need for great amounts of anxiety about the next several weeks. God wants us to be "strong and courageous" in the midst of change because God is with us.

We oppose all laws and policies that attempt to criminalize, dehumanize or punish displaced individuals and families based on their status as migrants, immigrants or refugees."
